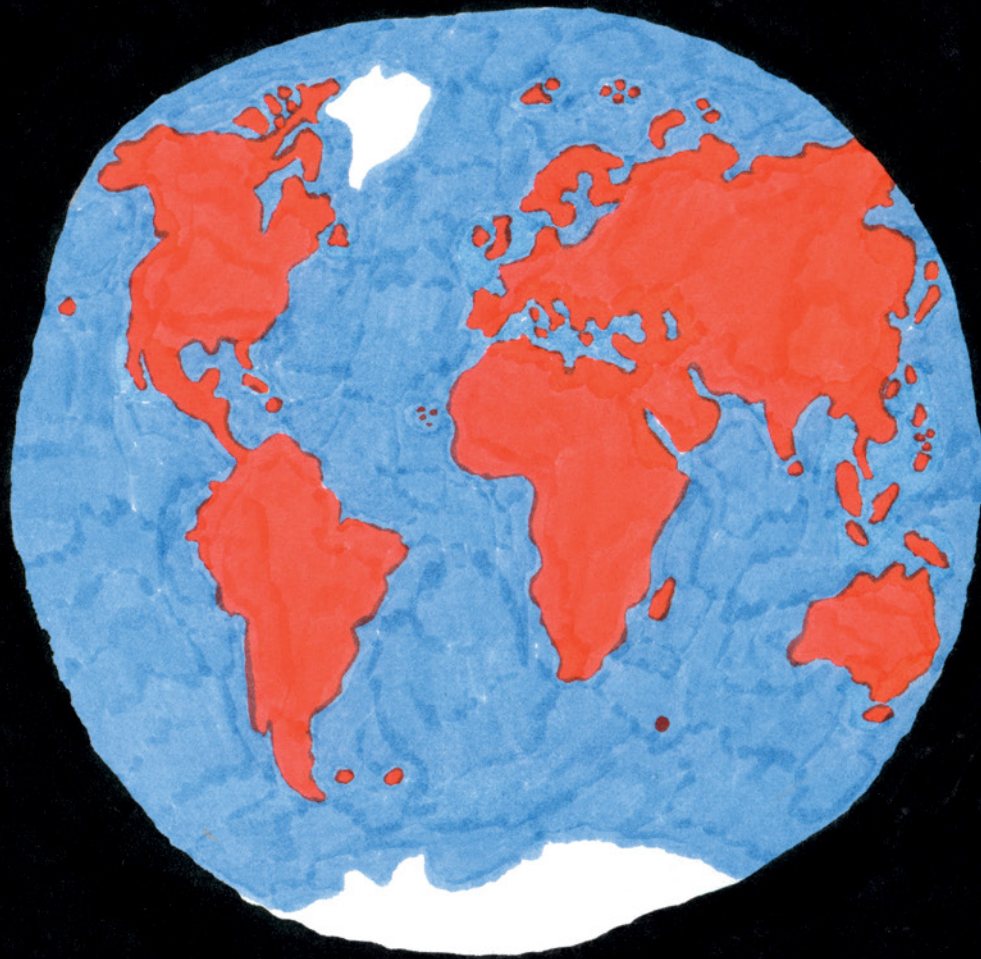

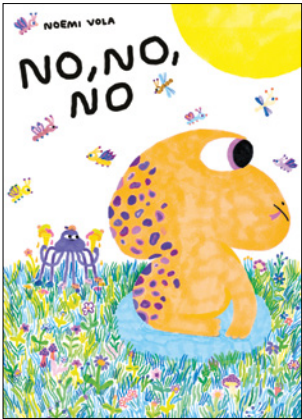

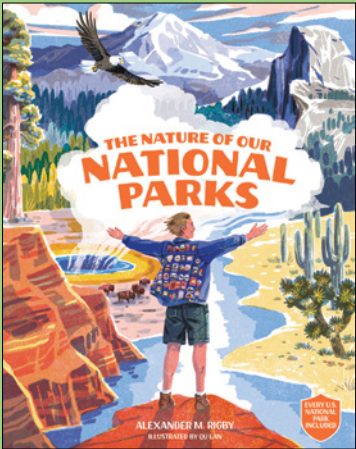

Spider keeps all these NOs tangled in his web, but when a storm sweeps everything away, it brings a new friend who helps him discover the value of YES.



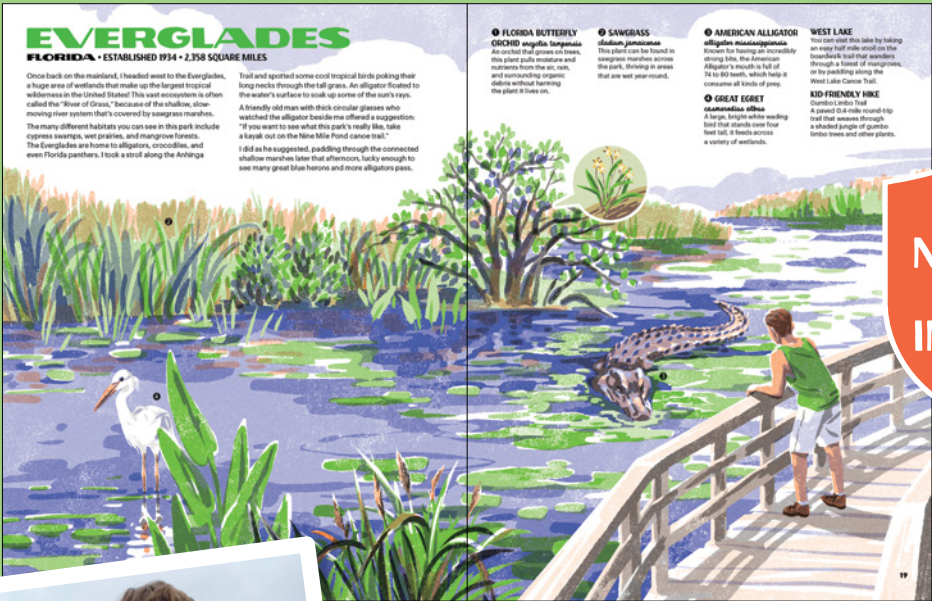

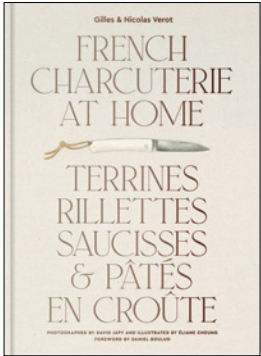


These fantastical, idiosyncratic buildings and sites straddle a space between art and architecture.
